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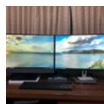
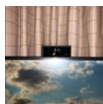
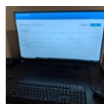

Simply put, this is a perfect all in one computer if you are looking for something that is more like a TV in form factor but has all the capability of a Windows computer. If you are limited on space, don't want to have a tower, don't want to limit yourself to the size of a laptop or don't want to have anything more than a power cord connected, this is for you. With the technical specs included in this model (listed below) it is a fully capable computer. However, don't expect it to be a high end gaming or editing machine with the Intel UHD 630 graphics. With that said, if you have a gaming console, you can plug it into this monitor by HDMI and push the source button on the bottom right side, just like a TV.

I'm personally not a fan of pre-made all in one machines, only because I'm a tech savvy type person that likes to customize and upgrade my computer. However, my kids and my parents don't need to be confused with all the internals. They just want to get on the internet, play their little games and watch videos while in

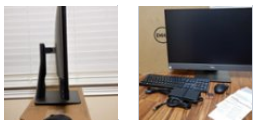
their dorm or bedroom with the familiarity of Windows operating system. This Dell Inspiron 7777 All-in-One is exactly for them.

The whole set up is a little heavy out of the box, around 20lbs, and the stand base attaches with a thumbscrew. A USB dongle is in the mouse to connect the included wireless mouse and keyboard, once it and the power is plugged in and batteries put in the keyboard and mouse, you are up and running in a matter of minutes. With the built in speaker, microphone and touchscreen, you don't even need the keyboard or mouse to get setup with Cortana. On that note, there is also a webcam and IR cam, for face recognition, in the top that pops up when pressed. Convenient for video calls and hiding the camera in case of privacy concerns.

I've never had a device so large that was touchscreen, but this has 10 point multitouch. Convenient for when you don't want to pull the mouse and keyboard out to maybe select a new video, close out a window or flip the page on whatever you are doing. Though this model from Best Buy comes with the pedestal stand that only tilts -5° to 30°, Dell has an option for an articulating stand which allows the screen to sit flat and you could turn this multitouch screen into a piano. The screen also has a satin like non-reflective surface that does pretty good with avoiding fingerprints. Touch it after eating some chips and you might need some isopropyl alcohol to wipe it down, as with any screen.

Some of the specifications on the Best Buy page are a little misleading, but this is exactly the hardware that came in mine.

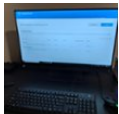

The included intel UHD 630 graphics are very bad for modern AAA games. 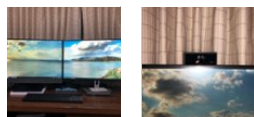

I was very excited to get my hands on this computer as I had been using a gaming rig for business and other professional uses, and although it handled the job well, there are aspect of a gaming computer that don't lend themselves into the studious works of a professional. The much larger screen that is touch screen, the saved space of no tower, the surprisingly loud speaker attached, all things that aren't typically included in the gaming PC, but are helpful and found on this PC when doing work.

As soon as I started to unpack this Dell All-In-One from the box, I immediately noticed that this computer is a tank. Its heavy, sturdy, and leaves no doubt that you have just put your hands on a quality piece of equipment. The stand is easily and firmly attached to the computer. I would recommend that you know where you are going to put this computer and have that space clear before removing the computer from the box, as I nearly dropped it attempting to move another electronic device out of the way. No, you won't need to team lift this computer, its just surprisingly heavy for its size.

Despite the heft, the computer's footprint on your desk is significantly smaller than a traditional pc. Which is always a plus as somehow clutter always seems to find its way onto my desk. Once the PC is in place, plug in the power cord, put the batteries into the supplied wireless keyboard and mouse, place the supplied Bluetooth dongle into one of the many USB ports, and power your new machine on.

If you haven't bought a new computer lately, Windows has become so easy to set up that you don't even need to touch your computer once you have powered it on for the first time. Windows's digital assistant Cortana talks to you and listens to your responses. I was cleaning up the packaging contents from the PC while Cortana walked me through setup from across the room. This was a very nice experience, and although Windows does the programming, it was immediately apparent that the installed speaker and mic were definitely up to par. Something that you may not know is that there is a webcam built in to the PC, but it is hidden into the top of the computer, and only comes out when you press on it. I use the camera to log in to the computer when I sit down. But for those of you that are security minded, its nice to be able to hide the camera so that you don't have to worry about digital prying eyes. Now that your computer is set up, take your keyboard & mouse and let the neighbor kids play with them while you run back to Best Buy and get a decent pair to use. Maybe I am spoiled with my higher end peripherals, but they feel cheap to me and the mouse is SLOW.

Initial impressions when using the computer are that the computer is very responsive due to the 8th Generation Intel i7, can handle lots of tasks at once with the 12gb of installed RAM, and was up to the challenge to any kind of professional task I had to throw at it with the 1 TB HD and large screen. Even when I got off task to browse media sites such as YouTube, it did it well. I have watched television shows on this computer, however the picture did not impress. It was acceptable, but definitely not "wow" worthy. Maybe its the lack of a premium graphics card that lends to this? Not sure. Where it lacked in picture, it did make up for in sound, however. I know I mentioned it before, but the sound of this computer just blows me away for being factory stuff. I definitely wouldn't mind listening to music without any aftermarket speakers.

There are a lot of good things in this computer, but with the lack of an SSD, old generation USB ports, and an adequate screen, this computer just feels like it came to the party just a little bit late. The boot times feel like this computer takes an eternity to boot compared to any of my other computers. Data transfer speeds are also limited to the USB 2.0 parameters. I have not opened up this computer yet, and maybe I can do some easy upgrades that would really make this thing fly (fingers crossed). But until then, this PC benchmarks in the middle of the pack.

Ultimately, this is a really good computer. Its a quality piece that checks a lot of the boxes. I will use the computer every day. I just wish they took the couple more steps to turn this computer from good to AMAZING.

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All-in-one with an odd identity crisis

I've always wanted a desktop computer that allows me to do more work faster, and in many respects this Dell Inspiron does that, but with some very odd and very real drawbacks I think you should know about.

First, the feature set. For the money, this Dell on paper gives you a lot - it has built-in speakers that aren't great but work well, a 1TB hard drive (more on this), tons of ports, including a USB type C 3.1 port on the side of the computer AND HDMI output ports. In short, this is a machine that is seemingly perfectly designed to give you incredible versatility in a desktop.

It's the things Dell chooses to skimp on when putting this together, though, that really cheapen the user experience, and I think it's important to know about. First and foremost, the panel used for the display is....bad. Like really bad. It has muted, dull colors with very poor contrast, and makes you feel like you're looking at a yellow screen. There's no way to calibrate the display, so it won't get better than it is out of the box. This becomes especially noticeable when you use those blessed HDMI outputs to hook up a second monitor. I'm not even talking resolution - this is a productivity machine, not a gaming one - but this screen looks bad next to almost any other display. I'm not kidding. You should really see this in person before you buy it.

The second really frustrating thing about this computer is that even after installing every available update, restarting, and closing all programs, there's no getting around the fact that this computer is slow. Much of this is down to the spinning 1TB hard disk, which, while generous in size, is a huge stepdown in speed if you've had any exposure to a solid-state drive in your laptop, tablet or phone. At this price, it would have been nice for Dell to include even a 128GB SSD to run programs off of, with the remaining 1TB drive for easy access to documents, movies and other static files. This would have dramatically increased a typical user's enjoyment of the PC.

What do I love? I love the bevy of ports. I really like the fact that I could hook up another monitor to this one, greatly improving productivity. I like the clarity of the speakers. I love that there's USB-C on the side, a nod to the future of ports - but I don't understand why it's not Thunderbolt 3 compatible, which would allow someone to hook up an external GPU and REALLY turn this into a video-photo editing powerhouse - at least, they would if the screen were reliably color accurate, which it isn't.

The one feature I thought I'd really treasure was that this is a matte-finish touchscreen all-in-one, which, on laptops, convertibles and tablets is a huge boon. But on a desktop, it's hard to see the value of this. I never lift my hand up to touch a monitor 3 feet away from my face. This computer can optionally ship with an articulating stand that will allow it to tilt down like a drafting table like the Surface Studio, but it doesn't seem like a sensible feature - Dell doesn't ship a special stylus to take advantage of this, and again, more than anything, the screen isn't at all accurate, which makes it a tough sell for any creative to want to use this for their work anyway.

I guess what I'm saying is that I feel very conflicted about this desktop. In many ways it is absolutely the desktop you could want for your home office, at least on paper. But in practice, it has a lot of shortcomings, some of which might be dealbreakers for some of you. Especially that screen! What I would say is to go to your local Best Buy and see this in person before you choose to purchase this.

This Dell all-in-one is a great computer for the majority of users. It has specs that can support small business use or the majority of home users. For hard-core gaming this is not your best choice. I doubt many true gamers would even consider an all-in-one PC, however if you're just an average gamer you'll probably be happy with this computer but not blown away. Overall, I would really give this 4.5 stars, but it's definitely better than five stars.

Design/Setup: Out of the box you get all-in-one with stand, power supply, keyboard, and mouse. Easy to set up and easy to start up. No-frills here. It is a nice-looking desktop but does not have a luxurious look to it. The biggest drawback being the speaker panel on the lower part of the screen. It's not a full edge to edge display which would have also been a nice touch. In general, it looks sleek and won't be an eyesore on your desk. Comparing it to something like an iMac, you're not going to get the same level of luxury. Stand is nice but it would have been better if it had the capability of more degrees of motion. Included keyboard and mouse are a huge miss on Dell's part. They look cheap and very basic. Fortunately, they are both wireless. Includes windows 10, which is definitely better than some of the previous versions of Windows of late. Starting from scratch, I was up and running in about 45 minutes.

Specs: I'm happy with the specs included for the most part. There are some key things that'll mention shortly that Dell should not have skipped out on. 1 TB hard drive, 12 GB RAM, and USB-C port were nice to see. This own one has the specs you need to get at least a few years of solid use without having to worry about upgrades. I really appreciate the amount of ports included on this computer. However, there are some huge misses. First, two USB ports are 2.0, this is completely unacceptable at this point. Fortunately there's a USB-C port and one USB 3.1, but many users have not adopted use of the USB-C even remotely. Lack of a thunderbolt compatible port is also disappointing since the graphics card included on this computer is subpar for higher end graphics and will benefit from the use of an external graphics card, which is not possible due to the lack of compatibility. There's an HDMI in and out which is awesome. Included Intel i7 processor has been a fast and responsive so far.

Screen: It's disappointing to see that Dell reverted to a full HD screen as standard versus a 4K screen on this year's model. The included screen is very nice and displays contrast as well as black/dark scenes well, but of course it's no match to 4K. I didn't struggle with display lag or motion blur when gaming or watching live sports. Again, edge to edge display would've been really nice here. Also, 27 inches is more than adequate and I really enjoy the large screen size.

Webcam: Not much to say here, the quality is good. Most importantly it's nice that it's a pop-up cam so you can hide it when not in use for privacy.

Speakers: The speakers are good-quality for being stock in an all-in-one PC. Decent bass with clear highs and mids at higher volumes. Of course aftermarket speakers would be best to supplement this computer, but if you're not too worried about listening to high-quality audio these will definitely get the job done.

In terms of performance, I'm quite happy with this all-in-one so far. I've used it for gaming, movies, Live sports, heavy productivity, and some light Photo editing. I have no concerns about speed or efficiency during heavy task use. Overall, I would recommend this all-in-one to most users since his specs are quite good even with a few key areas that Dell should have improved on.

I've had many desktop computers over the years and they always were "tower based" and not wanting to put the tower on the floor where it would get dusty and dirty, I've put it on my desk.

This new Dell Inspiron 7777 totally changed my way of thinking on that subject. The lack of a tower has given me SO much more 'real estate' on my desk. The only possible disadvantage is that it has no DVD drive of course. This is no problem because Best Buy sells DVD drives with USB plugs for less than 25 dollars (Seriously!) You'd just connect one into the USB port on the side of the monitor. Also a DVD drive usually isn't necessary anyway because most everything is available on the Internet. The computer also has the top of the line Intel i7-8700T processor. I've been looking at reviews of it and they're all universally positive about it.

I LOVE the huge 27-inch screen. What I first noticed and loved was that it's as anti-reflective as I've ever seen WHILE keeping all the sharpness I wanted. The monitor I had used before was great, but it reflected anything behind me. I kept moving it around all day trying to minimize the glare and the 'mirror effect' behind me. When I went to Skype with the 7777, I was at first confused because I couldn't find the camera. I knew it had one. Finally, I pushed the top of the monitor and a small camera smoothly appeared from inside. The picture was sharp and worked well with low light. I also liked the fact that when you're finished using it, you just push it back into the monitor. With all the talk about privacy today, you don't need to worry about THIS camera spying on you when you're not aware.

Once up and running I liked how easy it was to update drivers and Dell software. By going to the Dell "drivers and downloads" page and pushing a 'button' the website identified my computer by model and service tag. It then went inside and discovered Intel had an upgrade for my processor. With my permission it downloaded the software and upgraded the Intel device with very little assistance from me. It's nice to know how easy it is to keep the Inspiron totally up to date.

Bottom line, this is as cool a computer as I've ever had, WITHOUT the inevitable desktop tower taking up so much space. Out-of-the-box initial setup was fast & intuitive. The pedestal stand does not require any tools, and basic instructions are included. You do need to have or sign up for a Microsoft account in order to fully utilize the system. It comes loaded with Windows 10 Home which comes with tons of personalizing options. The automatic Dell updates seem to be glitchy so far. Just after setup, it ran a few updates with no problems. Then it froze twice during installation of a critical BIOS update.

Design - The modern, sleek black & gunmetal gray look goes well in office or home setting. The monitor's thin bezel on sides & top give it a minimalist feel. The speakers are hidden across the front/bottom. A nice touch, the camera is recessed, pop-up style, so it stays hidden until needed.

Display - I have to compare this to my current 2-year old AIO from another mainline mfr. The screen on this Dell is not glossy, but has more of a flat finish. This is great for reducing glare, but in comparing images & video with my other AIO, the colors were a bit muted and less crisp. The touch screen is fantastic. I much prefer a large screen to a laptop, and this is lightweight enough to be moved around when needed.

Speakers - Very tinny sounding when listening to music, but voice is clear & strong. Again, comparing to my other AIO (that has built-in Bang & Olufsen speakers), I actually cringed while watching my favorite music videos. I will definitely hook up some external speakers.

Keyboard & Mouse - Both are wireless & battery powered. The small USB receiver is uniquely hidden inside the mouse. The keyboard is standard and pretty quiet, but the mouse is very basic, uncomfortable & feels super cheap.

Although I wouldn't recommend this system for a heavy gamer or for entertainment without upgrading the speakers; overall, this is a good choice for a student or for home/office use.

I have been highly impressed by this computer. First off, every product I have ever purchased from Dell has been packaged extremely well, and this computer was no exception. Dell seems to take packaging to the next level, everything always feels very secure and safe as I open it and take out components. When it comes to setting up this computer, it really can be done in under ten minutes. And what seems to take the most time is cable management and routing. Otherwise attaching the monitor to the base and putting in batteries for the keyboard and mouse takes no time at all. One thing that I noticed that was rather strange while setting up was the power cord type, I would expect one long wire going to the wall, but really it is just like a laptop plug, two separate wires with a box in between the two. To me just seems strange, but be aware that you will have to find a spot for that power box. Both the mouse and keyboard that this computer comes with are really nice, they do not feel cheap and the only improvement I can think of is to make the keyboard backlit. Going thru the windows setup once the computer was on took the typical 10-15 minutes to complete. First thing I checked once up and running was the the screen quality and speaker quality. The refresh rate is what impressed me most about the screen, I for the life of me cannot figure out what the refresh rate is for this model but to me it is easily a 60hz, maybe even 120hz, I wish I knew for sure. I wanted a desktop when I work from home however I didn't want the typical screen/tower combo. I was looking for an AIO and this one seemed to fit the bill.

The screen is quite spacious and crisp. Touchscreen works quite well however I'm not certain how often I'll use this feature. Built-in speakers on the bottom of the screen are quite loud so no issue with sound here.

The camera is a bit odd in that it's recessed at the top of the top and can be opened by clicking on it which will spring it up. Took me awhile to find it but sorta cool. With the spacious 27" screen, conference calls seem to be a bit more nicer I think.

As far as specs, I think it's quite a solid setup. The i7 processor is speedy enough for my needs. I don't do any picture/video editing so I can't comment on performance. I mainly use this for "standard" work duties. 1TB hard drive is spacious as well however it seems a tad slow. I'm debating on swapping the HD out for a SSD just to speed things up. 12GB of RAM is plenty enough for virtually any task and multitasking doesn't seem to be an issue here. I believe the RAM can be upgraded to 32GB max however, I don't particularly see an immediate need to max out the RAM.

This has your standard slots/ports however the USB slots are 2.0. Would've been nice to have them 3.0. As far as ports, this pretty much has you covered on most, if not all, of them.

The keyboard/mouse that came with this is OK. I will definitely be swapping these out for something a little more ergonomic but, eh, they were included.

There isn't too much bloatware on this aside from the normal Dell/MS stuff. Uninstall McAfee and the Office trial and you should be set.

Setting up this all-in-one PC took no time at all, it's as simple as plugging in the power (which is similar to other Dell laptop power cords), and the small USB chip for the wireless keyboard and mouse. With a 27 inch display, you don't need to be very close to the screen - but if you are, you can leverage the touchscreen. I struggle to understand where using the touchscreen would make sense with a screen this large. Personally, I'd prefer a lightweight laptop to be where I'd take advantage of a touchscreen - but this could work well if that's what you're after. It's also wall mountable, which could come in handy for a small business office. I voted it down from 5 stars because after fully updating, I found that the screen could go into what appeared to be a version of sleep mode, but would never come out and recover. Dell's support was excellent in troubleshooting all of the possible causes and determined it was a known issue with "Connected Standby" in Windows 10. However, as great as support was, I'd prefer that they not ship the PC with that enabled if it's going to cause issues like this. If I had wall-mounted it, it wouldn't have been as easy to fix, as I'd have to find a way to remove power and re-apply it (that's the only answer when it got into this state). Further, the built-in webcam quality is very low - it would likely work fine for video chat, but for a modern PC to not have a HD webcam is surprising. I did like that it was hidden on the top of the screen and could be popped in and popped out as needed.

Getting this Dell all in one was a great move to replace my aging tower machine and de-clutter my work space.
